




#### **President's Message**

My day job is working as a school psychologist in a local district. I have been playing with clay for 27 years. I started out taking classes through Parks and Recreation at the Randolph Center in Tucson and then moved to Romero House Ceramics studio a few years ago. I feel very lucky to be able to work where I can explore many different ideas. I will never get bored working with clay!

I produce both hand-built and wheel-thrown functional pottery and the majority of my work is fired to Cone 6. For the past year, I have been exploring different surface designs and textures such as mocha diffusion, terra sigilatta, underglazes, and mono printing. I have been influenced by the work of Catherine White, Melissa Weiss, and Linda Styles to name a few.
