Mandala Mosaics A Student's Perspective



If you were lucky enough to take part in last month's mosaic workshop with Julie Stein, you already know it was a great success! I had never done mosaics before and I'm pretty sure the rest of the attendees had not either, but we had a great time. Julie has such a positive and upbeat attitude, and she is a great teacher.

We were able to choose from several designs for our piece, and templates and frames were provided. The workshop was broken out into 4 classes: making the tiles, glazing, adhering, and grouting. I'll confess, I was a week behind the whole time, but it wasn't an issue at all, I just paid attention and took notes.

I learned so much from Julie and the process. For example, I was working with stiffer clay than I usually do and figured out that I should probably be handbuilding that way more often. I chose to carve my tiles, again, something I had never tried, but I loved it! I will definitely be working on my carving skills and adding them to my work. Glazing took some time with all the small pieces, but it was very satisfying. The adhering of the tiles to the frame was super easy and went very quickly, and the grouting process was weirdly satisfying.

Julie was always ready to answer any questions that we had along the way, and to throw out creative ideas as we went along. She likes to say that "this is all make-believe" and to explore your ideas and try out new concepts as you go.

We all ended up with beautiful, very unique pieces, and it was fun to see how everyone put a different creative spin on our projects, even though they were very similar.

Thanks to everyone that participated and to those who worked behind the scenes to make this zoom workshop happen, plus a huge shout out to Julie, well done!
