# Get A Grip! How to Handle Your Pots Better

Date: Sunday, May 15, 2022 Time: 1:00 to 4:00 PM

Learn the forms and physics of good handles for your handmade drinking and pouring vessels. This workshop will cover:

- What makes a handle good or bad, both in relation to the human hand and the usage of the vessel.
- Six different ways to craft handles that are pleasing to the hand and eye.
- How to place and attach the handles to vessels and make sure they stay there through drying and firing.

This will be an interactive workshop. Participants are asked to prepare in advance at least one handbuilt or wheel thrown vessel, and have it in the "gouda to cheddar cheese" state (aka soft leather hard), trimmed if necessary, to attach handles to during the workshop. Feel free to bring several. You should have these vessels along with 5 pounds of the same clay body, fresh, and a basic ceramics tool kit ready for use.

- The jurors' decision about your work will be emailed to you by the Jury Coordinator within two days. The decision is "Accepted" or "Deferred."

This is the second jury session for 2022. SPACE IS LIMITED to the first 12 SACA applicants. If you want to be placed on the wait-list, complete the entire application, pay the fee, and the Jury Coordinator will notify you if the session can accommodate you.
