- The jurors' decision about your work will be emailed to you by the Jury Coordinator within two days. The decision is "Accepted" or "Deferred."

*This is the second jury session for 2022.* SPACE IS LIMITED to the first 12 SACA applicants. If you want to be placed on the waitlist, complete the entire application, pay the fee, and the Jury Coordinator will notify you if the session can accommodate you. Empty Bowls is an international project to fight hunger. These bowls are made by individual artists and art organizations on a community level. The empty bowl is a symbol of awareness of those in need among us. Interfaith Community Services has been a part of the Tucson community for 35 years helping people in need achieve stable, healthy, and independent lives.

This is the 12th year ICS has hosted this event which greatly benefits our community. As you can imagine, the needs of the ICS foodbank have greatly increased and we expect an even higher need in 2023. Each year they set out all the beautiful bowls our potters make at one location and allow attendees to pick out their special bowls. Choosing a new bowl is the biggest reason people attend this event year after year.









We hope you will start handbuilding or get your wheels to throwing, fire up your kiln, and craft your own special bowls for the event. Bowls are generally soup bowl size (think 1-1.5 pounds) and should be food safe.

SACA is excited to announce that we have partnered with the Marshall Foundation for a new show in March 2023 at Main Gate Square in the Geronimo Plaza (University Blvd & Tyndall) This is not only a new venue, it is also a whole new format for a SACA show. Artists will handle their own cashiering and keep 100% of their sales. Artists pay no commission. Our show will be the same weekend as the Tucson Festival of Books which generates massive foot traffic in the University area.

Registration will open at noon on Monday, January 2, 2023, and the fee to participate will be \$75.00. Tables, table coverings, grids, chairs, and a limited number of 10x10 canopies will be available.
