Artists Registration Opens Monday, January 2, 2023, 12 Noon

SACA is excited to announce that we have partnered with the Marshall Foundation for a new show in March 2023 at Main Gate Square in the Geronimo Plaza (University Blvd & Tyndall).

This is not only a new venue, it is also a whole new format for a SACA show. Artists will handle their own cashiering and keep 100% of their sales. Artists pay no commission. Our show will be the same weekend as the Tucson Festival of Books, generating massive foot traffic in the University area.

Registration Fee: \$75.00. Each artiist will share a tent and have a table and chairs for sales & wrapping. Set up tables, and grids will be available through the registration process.

You may set up on Friday evening or early Saturday morning. Drop-off access will be available. The nearest parking is the Tyndall Garage. Keep an eye on your email for more information about drop off and set up details.

Overnight security will be provided on Friday and Saturday.

Membership Registration

Membership Fees

- Individual Membership fees are \$30 annually
- Family Membership (2 family members sharing the same studio) are \$45 annually.
- They qualify for extended membership after 9/1 and all of the following year. ‡

Definitions for New, Renewing or Returning

- **NEW** Members: are people who have never previously joined in SACA. They qualify for extended membership. Join in September and get membership through the end of the current year until the end of the following year.
- **RENEWING** Members: Members must renew by January 31 of the following year or membership is tagged late and may be subject to being lapsed. Renewing Members are those with no lapse or a one-year lapse in membership. They pay full dues no matter when in the year they renew.
- **RETURNING** Members: have not paid dues for two or more years. They qualify for extended membership period after 9/1 and all of the following year.

I have lived in Tucson for over ten years. First as a snowbird and now as an ardent desert rat whose work reflects the look and feel of my surroundings.

I am a hand-builder, using pinch, coil, and slab construction rather than a potter's wheel. Without the demands of the spinning of a wheel, I feel I can work with greater spontaneity and unpredictability. Without the need for water to reduce the friction of spinning clay, outer surfaces fold, crack, even break as the air dries the clay. At times as quickly as I work. It's all about touch and texture.

I have shown my work in juried shows in Chicago and Tucson. My most recent exhibit was a curated show with painter Lauren Harvey at the Jewish Community Center in Tucson.




I had been trying to find my inner artist for as long as I can remember. Over the years I have tried many things: drawing, painting, photography, blown glass, fused glass, jewelry making. I never really found the right media. Until I took a hand-building class in 2015. The moment my hands touched the clay I knew I had found my passion! I lost track of time, and the three-hour class flew by in what felt like just minutes.

Most of my work is created in my home studio. I use stoneware, simple tools, a variety of textures, and custom and commercial glazes and oxides. I also adore the excitement of the Raku process and attend a community firing as often as possible.







Call to all potters from ICS! We need BOWLS!

Interfaith Community Service's Empty Bowls is on for March 4, 2023, at the Tucson Chinese Cultural Center.

Empty Bowls is an international project to fight hunger. These bowls are made by individual artists and art organizations on a community level. The empty bowl is a symbol of awareness of those in need among us. Interfaith Community Services has been a part of the Tucson community for 35 years helping people in need achieve stable, healthy, and independent lives.

This is the 12th year ICS has hosted this event which greatly benefits our community. As you can imagine, the needs of the ICS foodbank have greatly increased and we expect an even higher need in 2023. Each year they set out all the beautiful bowls our potters make at one location and allow attendees to pick out their special bowls. Choosing a new bowl is the biggest reason people attend this event year after year.

Start hand-building, get your wheels to spinning, fire up your kiln, and craft your own special bowls for the event. Bowls are generally soup bowl size (think 1-1.5 pounds) and should be food safe.
