


From our President

We offer weekly clay classes with specialty classes every month.

We will be Salt Firing with Joni Pevarnik this Feb/March. In March and April, we have a Sculpture class with Jada Ahern.

Clay: "Salt-a-licious" Salt-Firing with Joni

Prerequisite: Ability to create your own Cone 10 clay work

Instructors: Joni Pevarnik and Jada Ahern

On 2/17, Joni will demo pieces designed to take advantage of the beauty of the salt glaze surface. Please bring green ware in progress for advice. Bisque fire 2/20. On 2/24, we will glaze our bisque ware. Bring what will fit into a closed 50 lb. clay box. Make sturdy pieces. Plates, lidded pieces and tiles are not recommended. You can register for the class, attend one or both days and/or drop off your Cone 10 pots at NWAC by 3/7. Optionally, attend the evening potluck and kiln salting at El Fuego Pottery in Vail Arizona 3/10. Finished pieces available for pick up at NWAC. Materials fee \$25. Human Anatomy For Ceramic Sculptors

In this course, students will learn the anatomy and proportions necessary to create dynamic poses and will gain an understanding of how gesture affects the end result.

Over the course of 4 weeks, students will learn to sculpt various sections of the body through quick studies and apply this in the production of a finished, small scale, full clay figure.

Work will be bisque fired.
The class includes discussion of surface treatment options and the possibility of high firing.

Please bring your sculpting tools and cone 10 clay (B-Mix is recommended).

A former sculptor of facial prosthetics at the James J. Peters V.A. hospital in New York,... Jesse offers a unique expertise concerning the human face.

In this course, you'll learn the underlying anatomy affecting various facial expressions, and how to incorporate that knowledge into works of clay.

You'll produce a life-size bust, ready for bisque firing! Surface treatments are discussed, including stains, glazes & acrylics. Time permitting, we will do a final high-firing of glazed or stained pieces!

NOTE: Firing, use of studio glazes/stains & over 40 hours of studio time are included in your fee! Please bring your preferred cone 10 clay to the first class.

to enhance your creativity.
You'll apply color to your work
with under glazes and glazes, then
complete your composition
by adhering your mosaic pieces
to a backing board*
and sealing with grout.

Dana Lehrer Danze is a potter with a studio at the Torpedo Factory Art Center in Alexandria, VA. She has exhibited in national and international juried shows including Baltimore Clayworks "100 Teapots", Craft Forms Annual International Exhibition in Wayne PA, the Art League International Juried Exhibition "Tea", has had several solo shows and has won numerous awards. Dana has taught workshops in throwing various forms and decorating with resists, glazes, and slips.

Dana is known for her distinctive style of stoneware teapots, decorated with images like spirals, vines and trees. She mainly works in blue and green glazes, contrasting the glaze designs with red-brown clay. She will be demonstrating her thrown and altered teapots and other forms. She will also demo some of her decorating techniques, including wax resist, and there will be an opportunity for participants to decorate some sample pieces.

Saturday will be a demonstration day where she will show the shapes that she makes to combine and alter to form her teapots. She will also show how she makes the tall handles, which make a statement when added to her forms.

Sunday Dana will demonstrate her glazing techniques and then you will have a chance to decorate some sample pieces.
