Hand builders this workshop is for you!



Have you ever wanted to build something tall (over a foot tall) but all you are able to handle is something short. This class is for you. Mark Epstein is a hand builder that makes tall pots easily and quickly. He will be coming to Tucson to show us how. Not only will he make tall pots from a single slab but he will also show us how to make pots from an extruded hollow form and they won't necessarily form a straight cylinder. Watching him keeps me spellbound because if you look away for a minute the pot is formed and you wonder how he did it. This workshop will be a FOUR DAY hands on experience.

So keep August 2 through 5 open so that you can experience the wonder.



Mark loves playing in clay because to him that is exactly what he is doing,

playing. It affords him the freedom to express ideas and feeling in a way that no other material will allow. He has been playing in clay for over 30 years and has not grown tired of the quest. Clay is a great imitator. It allows you to mimic surfaces that you are exposed to every day. That is why he works with soft textured slabs. It allows him to exploit the plasticity so inherent to the material. He enjoys the play between the textures and the rich colors in the layering of the high fire glazes. Combining the layering of glazes with the textures helps create a depth of surface in the finished piece.

Mark has earned 2 masters degrees from the University of Dallas, Irving, Texas and maintains a studio in Dallas and is working on another in Pagosa Springs Colorado. He presents workshops nationally.

Ayumi's Dry throwing uses no water for making all low pottery forms, like bowls, dishes, plates. She also developed a technique where she trims to center w/a pin tool, scoops out the inside w/a loop tool



Underglaze Transfer Technique

with Eric L. Stearns

Eric reveals the steps to successful image transfer using underglazes & a Laser Printer! Well worth mastering this incredible technique that adds so much to your surface decoration!

(NOTE: you'll have to wait thru an Amazon ad for the video start!)

& then thins the walls by pushing out w/a rib.

She uses no water because she likes the surface of moist clay, rather than wet.

This allows her to preserve the inherent textures in clay that she loves,

...the stretching, cracking, and sagging.
