

#### **STATUS**

#### **IMPLEMENTATION DATES**

Many ideas will be followed up by member volunteers. Three are actively in planning right now:

- In January Bambi Anderson will host a Mug Meet to discuss many clayrelated topics.


No commission will be taken by SACA.
