SACA is pleased to announce a new concept to showcase SACA member talent: The SACA Marketplace.

At events designated as a Marketplace, ALL our members are eligible to show and sell their work in any medium, not just their clay work. Your work must be original, created by you and you must include your pottery work.

You do not have to be juried to participate. You may request a mentor when you register to coach you with showing and selling your work. And best of all, at a SACA Marketplace, there is no commission. Each artist keeps 100% of their sales.

Are you a painter? A glass artist? Photographer? Woodworker? Jewelry maker? Bring your art and craft to the Marketplace!
