Tips & Tricks

Do you struggle with trying to keep glaze out of certain areas while dipping planters and other pieces with holes in the glaze bucket? Check out this great tip from artist <u>Kirsti Kash</u>, who was recently featured in Pottery Making Illustrated.

Use ear plugs to fill the holes when dipping your pieces! They're flexible, squishy, and will expand to fit small holes blocking the glaze from getting through. They can even be washed and reused a few times.


