

Mary Swallow Website & Technology Manager


Mary first started with clay in a class at Tempe Parks and Recreation. She quickly become obsessed and took classes at Mesa Community College.

Bead! Glorious Beads! 2.0

International artist, Vladislav Ivanov, returns to Tucson for the 2024 Bead Show (January 27 thru February 3, 2024) and will offer a workshop that builds on the techniques he shared with us during the original workshop in 2019.

Join us February 5 through 7 for a 3day workshop, when you will learn to make beads using a press mold, originally designed for glass lampwork. Then learn his technique for decorating these elaborate creations. You will also have an opportunity to create your own sprig mold used to make pendants and adaptable to use on any ceramic piece. Each student will receive a selection of pre-made greenware beads to decorate with the techniques learned in class. Bisque and glaze firing included.
